OVERVIEW

India remains a bright spot in the global steel industry. The India Steel Pipes and Steel Tubes Market size was estimated at USD 32.88 billion in 2023. During the forecast period between 2024 and 2030, this market is projected to grow at a CAGR of 6.43%, reaching USD 37.69 billion by 2030. Prominent drivers include growing demand for oil & gas, increased need for steel pipes worldwide, a thriving transportation sector, and a resurgence in construction activities post-pandemic. Additionally, substantial investments in R&D programs bolster production facilities. The oil & gas sector contributes the highest market share and revenue.

India Plastics pipes market was valued at 474.47 billion in 2023 and is expected to exhibit a 14.18% CAGR during the forecast period. Plastic pipes and tubes, including PVC (Polyvinyl Chloride), CPVC (Chlorinated Polyvinyl Chloride), HDPE (High-Density Polyethylene), and PPR (Polypropylene Random), play a vital role in modern infrastructure and industries. Known for their durability, versatility, and cost-efficiency, they are widely used across multiple sectors

The Government of India has launched several initiatives to bolster economic growth and infrastructure development. These include the Capital Expenditure Push, Jal Jeevan Mission, Har Ghar Jal Yojna, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY), Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (UIDF), Pradhan Mantri Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG) Development Mission, Eklavya-Model Residential Schools, Infrastructure Finance Secretariat, PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan, Revamp of Major Railway Stations, Expansion of Oil & Gas Sector, Renewable Energy Transmission Projects, Capital Expenditure Push, Support for Digital Public Infrastructure, and Financial Assistance for Micro Irrigation in Drought-Prone Regions.
